

The deposition of Richard Moore sen^r aged seaventeen years or thereabouts
sworn saith that he is in London and at the house of Mr. Thomas Weston from me-
nager in the year 1620 & it was from thence transported to New Plymouth in New
England and about two years and a half after his said departure arrived at Plymou-
th aforesaid in about mentioned Thomas Weston sent over a ship upon his p^rper
attempt with passengers to settle in the Massachusetts Bay now called Braintree
but soon after they desirous for same by reason of Indians & Indians etnd within a
short space of time after his arrival said Weston personally came over from London
to Plymouth in New England and made his abode there some time and traded
from thence into Virginia and Maryland etnd at that time the said dependent found
that the said Thomas Weston had and was possessed of two plantations set out
in York River in Virginia at a place called Eastgate, 2 miles in Maryland at
West St. Mary's by George Island and Eastgate were commonly known to be in the
service company of these persons hereunder deprest viz: M^r. Wilkinson in D^rent
intress^r and they all acknowledged the said Weston to be the true proprietor and
lawfull owner of said plantations etnd further that the said dependent unto Elizabeth
Weston now Elizabeth Comant of marble head to be her reputed and only child of the
said Thomas Weston

unto affixed appeared before me Simon Bradstreet Esq^r Governor of the Majestys
Colony of the Massachusetts Bay in New England on the day of the date of this present
in very good health & sound for better of attorney) servante and engaged to be her att^r
deid & that these art to testify that William Hawthorne who hath subscribed his
name to some of the testimonies hereunto affixed was on the day of the date named
out of the Majestys office aforesaid Colony and had power to administer oaths
in his and other like cases & therefore full faith and credit is ought to be given
hereunto In testimony whereof at the request of the above named Elizabeth Comant
I have set my hand and caused the publick seal of the said Colony of
the Massachusetts Bay to be set unto affixed the 27th day of Sept: anno Domini one
thousand six hundred eighty four et anno q^r Caroli Etudi iiii d^r Anglie

Memorandum that I [affidavit] John Comant by virtue of his
power to me [before] granted and for his atting and prostituting his intent of
the same have been nominated and appointed Thomas Burford attorney for the Province
of Maryland to have & to hold the office of attorney of the Province Court
of the Province to plead manage and present all matters & things relating to law
in order to recovering & right of his injured Elizabeth Comant to any hands & men
desirous in the Province of Maryland witness my hand this 27th March 1685
