year of the Dominion of the Right Honorable Charles Absolute Lord and  
Prop<sup>r</sup> of the Province of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of  
Baltimore &c and in the year of Our Lord God one thousand six-  
hundred eighty and six Betweene Vincent Lowe of the County of  
Talbot in the Province of Maryland Esq<sup>r</sup> of the one part and William  
Burgesse of Ann Arundell County in the aforesaid Province of  
Maryland Esq<sup>r</sup> of the other part Witnesseth that the said Vincent Lowe  
for and in consideration of the full and just sume of twenty six thousand  
pounds of good sound & every way well conditioned Merchandable tobacco  
& Casque to Conteyne the same to him in hand paid by the said William  
Burgesse all and before the executing & delivery of these presents the receipt  
whereof by the said Vincent Lowe doth hereby acknowledge and himselfe  
therewith fully satisfied & thereof and every part thereof doth clearly acquit  
concrete and discharge the said William Burgesse ~~at and before the~~  
~~executing~~ his heirs & Adm<sup>r</sup> and every of them for ever by these presents  
hath given granted aliened bargained sold Enfeoffed and Confirmed  
and by these presents doth fully clearly and absolutely give grant  
alien bargain sell enfeoff and Confirme unto the said William Burgesse  
his heirs and assignes for ever all those two ~~tracts~~ severall tracts or  
parcelles of Land hereafter in these presents particularly mentioned and  
expressed (that is to say All that one tract or parcelle of Land called  
Painters rest lying on the west side Chaptan River at the head of the said  
River in Cecil County Beginning at a marked Chestnut tree standing on a  
bank by a valley near the River side being an Easterly bounded tree of  
a parcelle of Land laid out for Samuel Will and from thence bounded with  
the River on the South by a line drawne East South East Seventy five
