Dominion of the Right Honorable Charles Absolute Lord and Prop^{ty} of the
Province of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore & Anno 1686
Tomini One thousand six hundred Eighty six Between Richard Keene of
Palmouth in the County of Calvert in the Province of Maryland Esquire
and Mary his wife of the one part, and Henry Lowe of the County aforesaid
Gent of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Richard Keene and Mary his
wife for and in consideration of the sume of forty thousand pounds of
lobbanoe to them in hand paid by the said Henry Lowe before the Eustalin
and delivery of these presents the Receipt whereof the said Richard Keene
and Mary his wife doe hereby acknowledge and thercof and of every part
and part thereof doe clearly and absolutely acquit Exonerate and Discharge
him the said Henry Lowe his Executors and Adm^{rs} by these presents and for
divers other goods caused and valuable Considerations them therunto
moving have given granted Aliens Bargained and sold and by
these presents doe give granted Alien Bargaine sell Eustoffe and
Confirme unto the said Henry Lowe his heirs and Assignes forever
all that tract or parcel or Parcel of lands called Spry Hill lying on
the East side of Chesapeake Bay on the North side of a River in the
said Bay called Sasparay River next adjoining to the lands formerly
laid out for Godfrey Harmer Beginning neare the head of a Branch
called Harward Branch at a marked by a Juniper tree standing upon the
side Hill near to the mouth of a Creek called Spryed Creek running
for breadth by the said lands and River South East three hundred and
twenty perches on the north by a line drawne North west and by East
three hundred perches to a marked Oak by the River side bounding
on the East by a line drawne North and by west for length three hundred
and twenty perches on the north by a line drawne North west and by west
from the end of the North West line untill it Intersect a parallel drawne
from Spryed Creek on the West with the said Creek on the South
with the said River bounding and heretofore laid out for six hun
dred Acres more or lesse And also all that other parcel of lands
called Mount Harmer lying on the East side of Chesapeake Bay
and on the north side of a River in the said Bay
called Sasparay River near unto the lands formerly laid out for Axel
Still Beginning on the East side of a Branch called Axels Branch
and running South East up the River for breadth one hundred perches
to a Branch called Harmer Branch bounding by the said Branch
running North North East up the Branch for length three hundred and
twenty perches on the North by a line drawne North west from the end
of the North East line untill it Intersect a parallel
