Upon the humble petition of Robert Carville gentle & Johanna his wife one of the daughters of Alexander D'Anyosa gentle late of this Province & deceased in Holland this day exhibited here into this Court as well on the behalfe of themselves as for & on the behalfe of Alexander, Mary, Johanna, & Barbara D'Anyosa brothers & Sisters of the said Johanna & Children of the said Alexander deceased thereby setting forth that the said Alexander D'Anyosa was in his life time seized of a parcel of land called Hoplars Island or Thompsons Island situate in the County of Kent in the said Province of Maryland & being so seized made his last Will & Testament in writing whereby devised the said Land to be equally divided amongst his said five children & shortly after dyed in Holland as aforesaid By vertue of which Will the said Petitioners are become Entituled to a fifth part of the premises. But for want of the said Original Will or an Authentique copy thereof & sufficient authority from their said Brothers & Sisters Alexander, Mary & Barbara (Johanna) living with the Petitioners both which they will endeavour to prouide with what speed may be, they cannot make appeare their legall interest in the said Land And there being no person in this Province in Law as yet reparated to looke after the same, the said Petitioners & their Brothers & Sisters are & will be much dammised, for in the interim the Land will be much wasted & spoiled the timber putt downe, the houses runn to ruine, the tenant in possession not recompensible to pay his rent now & hereafter to be in Arreard nor can any improprietie made of the premises And therefore they prayed that this Court would Impower the said Robert Carville for & on the behalfe of himselfe & wife & their said other brothers & sisters to take the said Land into his possession for the use of the said Petitioners & lett the same as he shall fit his fittyness as he can prouide the said Will & authority from his Brothers & Sisters as aforesaid This Court whereupon taking the premises into consideration, & considering also the great prejudice may be done to the said Land by remitting of waste & spoyle & suffering the houses to fall to ruine & other damages done therin fitt & so order that the said Robert Carville be & is hereby authorized & impowered to take into his possession the said Land & to recive the rent Arreard & to sett & let the same for the use above said as he shall think convenient, & to endeavour to restrain all waste & spoyle in what nature soever hee shal by such tyme as he can get the said Will & suer power out of Holland as aforesaid

That M^r Robert Doyne hath much prejudiced yo: Spouse & humble petition^r by a Survey he hath lately made into his land & taken away great part of his Outland & pasture & a tobacco house with a considerable quantity of rough land uncleared to the great damage & injury of yo: Spouse & humble Petition^r the which said land Outland & house hath bin in the possession of Cap^t Robert Trope & yo: Petition^r this thirteen or fourteen years, & hath bin alwayes accounted by the Neighbourhood to be the land the said Trope in his life time held, but by some mistake of the aforesaid M^r Robert Doyne & Richard Edlen Surveyor hath taken the said land away by their Survey, & hath forwarued yo: Petition^r from making use of the said Outland housing ground or pertaining to his great damage for which reason yo: Petition^r beggs yo: Hono: will be pleased to order a Survey to Resurvey the said land, & that there may be a Jury of the Neighbourhood Impannelled to be there, that yo: Hono: may be informed who the land taken away belongeth to, & that yo: Petition^r may not be so wronged by the loss thereof unjustly And as in duty bound yo: humble Petition^r shall ever pray for yo: Hono:

I desire that an order may be past in the Provinciall Court for a writ to be directed to the Sheriff of Charles County for the impanneling an Inquest of the Neighbourhood to lay out a tract of land belonging to M^r Robert Doyne called Rotterdam in Charles County purchased by the said Doyne of the R^r Honble the Lord Prop^r as also an order to Charles Boteler to attend the Inquest, & an order to the Survey to deliver a copy of the Certificate of the former Survey to the said Boteler for his regulation therin, requiring the said Sheriff to make a returne of the report of the Inquest upon the Resurvey to the next Provinciall Court.
