Upon the petition of Clement Hill late High Sheriff of St. Maryes County, that he stands amerced in this Court for not having the bodies of Edward Morgan & Richard Oraine at this Court, they being arrested at the suite of Cap^t. Sijd & Abraham Couber, & that the said suites are agreed & the parties intempnified, & humbly prays -

Ordered by the Court here, that the said American be remitted

April 28th 1677

Upon the petition of Henry Mitchell, that he was Sumoned to attend here this Court by Patrick Sudaivant Admistr^r John Nevill, to testify against John Desiardins, and prayeth Order of this Court for his coming going & attendance in all sixteen dayes

Ordered by the Court, that the aforesaid Patrick Sudaivant pay to the said Henry Mitchell for his coming going & attendance at this Court to give in his Evidence against John Desiardins the sume of four hundred & eighty pounds of tobacco -

April 21th 1677

Upon the Petition of Thomas Tailer of Dorchester County, that at a Provincial Court held in Novemb^r 1675, his Lordsh^{ps} the Lord Prop^r did rounde an Aron against him for four thousand pounds of tobacco, that the tobacco is since paid as p^r receipt may appear yett the Aron remains still continued upon the docket, which he prays may be withdrawn

Ordered by the Court that the aforesaid Aron be discontinued -

April 28th 1677

Upon the Petition of John Darby that he was Sumoned to attend here this Court by James Ringolds to testify ag^t John Wears, & prayeth Order of this Court for his coming going & attendance in all nineteen dayes.

Ordered by the Court, that the aforesaid James Ringolds pay to the said John Darby for his coming going & attendance at this Court to give in his Evidence ag^t John Wears the sume of five hundred & seventy pounds of tobacco -

April 23th 1677

Upon the petition of Richard Crasford, that at his arrivall into this Province he was sold to Walter Watering for four years, & after the death of the said Watering became servant to John Barnes whom he served two years over & above the four years for running away And that the said Barnes hath sold him to Samuel Parker for two years, yett to come, & desires order for his freedom -

In yo^r Judgement of the Court that the said Richard Crasford is not free -
