

This Indenture made the third day of October Anno Domini one thousand six hundred Eighty five and in the first yeare of the Reigne of James the second King of England Between Marij Elling Spinster of the one party and Joseph Jones now bound for Maryland in the shipp: William and Thomas on the other Party Witnesseth that the said Marij Elling Doth thereby Covenant promise and grant to and with the said Joseph Jones his Executors and assigns from the day of the date hereof until her first and next arrival in Maryland and after for and during the term of foure yeares to serve in such Service and Imployment as he the said Joseph Jones or his assigns shall there Imploij her according to the Custom of the country in the like kind: In Consideration Whereof the said Joseph Jones doth hereby Covenant and grant to and with the said Marij Elling to pay for her passing and to find and allow her Meat drink apparel and Lodging with other Necessaries during the said Terme and at the End of the said Terme to pay unto the said Marij Elling double apparel and all other Necessaries and things according to the Custome of the said Country and the said Marij Elling doth affirm her selfe to be Twenty one yeares of age on the day of the date of these presents In Witnesse Whereof the parties above mentioned to these Indentures have Enterchangeably Set their hands and seals the day and yeare above written

Know all men by these presents that wee John Walls of old England Marriner and Thomas Cemberton of Somerset County in the province of Maryland Marchant are held & firmly bound unto John Addison of s<sup>t</sup> Maryes County in the full sume of fouer hundred pounds of good & Law full Money of England to be paid to the said John Addison or to his Certaine attorney his Ex<sup>rs</sup> ad<sup>rs</sup> or assigns to the which payement well & truly to be made wee bind us and either of us owe & either of ours heires Ex<sup>rs</sup> and adm<sup>rs</sup> formally by these presents sealed with our seals and Dated the 30<sup>th</sup> day of march annoq<sup>m</sup> Domini 1683

The Condition of the above is such that Whereas one James Milles of the province of Maryland Gent hath comenced an acc<sup>on</sup> against the said John Walls in the provinciall Court of the said province for two hundred pounds of good & Law full Money of England Debt, and Whereas also the said James Milles hath Issued out of the said Court a writt of Ne Excat provinciam, against the said John Walls that hee departe nott this province till hee give security or answer the said James the said acc<sup>on</sup>, of debt and Whereas also the said John Addison together with the said Thomas Cemberton at the speciall instance and request of the said John Walls are held and firmly bound into two hundred pounds of good & Law full Money of England that the said John Walls shall answer the aforesaid acc<sup>on</sup>
