

On the south by a line drawne west south west from the said lake for length Three Hundred and twenty pches on the west with a line drawne North west from the end of the west south west line Seaventy five pches on the north with a line drawne East north East from the end of the North west line unto the first marked lake Conteyning and layd out for One Hundred and fifty acres more or lese **and** also one other parcell of land called Utisly lying in facill County on the East side of Cheseapeake Bay and on the south side of a River in the said bay called Sasafrax River Begining at a marked lake Standing at the mouth of a branch called the fishing Creek running downe the said Creek and River for breadth One Hundred and fifty pches to a branch bouding on the East by the said branch Running south South East for length Three Hundred and twenty pches on the south with a line drawne south west from the end of the south South East line untill it Intersect a parallel drawne from the first branch on the west with the said parallel and branch on the North with the said Creek and River Conteyning and layd out for Three Hundred Acres more or lese all which three last mentioned parcels of land were by Patent bearing date the Eighteenth day of July 1684 Graunted to Richard Bennet deceased **alsoe** all that parcell of land called Bennets Hope lying in a River on the East side of Cheseapeake Bay called Sasafrax River in a Creek on the south side of the said River called Turneyes Creek and on the south west side of the said Creek in facill County Beginning at a marked lake Standing on a long pyney poynt by a small Branch close by the narrowing of the said Poynt Running from the said lake up the branch for breadth One Hundred pches to a marked red lake Standing a little above the head of the said branch on a hill by a swampe bouded on the said lake by a line drawne south and by East for length into the woods Three Hundred and twenty pches bouded on the south and by East by a line drawne North East to the aforesaid Creek Together with the said Creek Conteyning and layd out for Two Hundred Acres more or lese Graunted to Richard Bennet deceased by patent bearing date the Fifteenth day of September 1685 **alsoe** all that parcell of land called The Hills lying in Turneyes Creek aforesaid in Sasafrax River in facill County Conteyning by Estimation Four Hundred Acres be the same more or lese formerly belonging to Philimon Loyd Gent. deceased and by him bought of one Richard Leake and also all that plantation tract or parcell of land lying on the East side of Cheseapeake Bay and in a River called Sasafrax River and in a Creek called Bennetts Creek in facill County aforesaid in the South East branch of the Creek on the North side of the branch neare the head of the Branch Begining at a marked Red lake in the woods by the head of a Valley and returning south west and by south to a marked white lake Standing by the side of a branch seaventy five pches by a line drawne from the said white lake and Running South East up along with the branch for length Three Hundred and twenty pches by a line drawne from the end of the south East line and running North East and by North Seaventy five pches by a line drawne from the end of the North East and by North line and running North west unto the first bounded red lake Conteyning and layd out for One Hundred and fifty Acres more or lese called Castles poynt which said Castles land was given to the said Susanna and her Heires by John Darnall Esq: her late husband deceased **alsoe** all that tract or parcell of land called Henrietta Maria lying in Charles County on the branches of the Easterne branch of Potomack River Begining at a Spanish lake on the west side of the North west side and at the mouth of a small branch and running East for length of One Hundred and sixty pches to a black lake then North for the length of Five Hundred pches to a Hickery then west for the length of One Hundred and sixty pches to a marked lake then with a streight line to the first bound tree layd out for five hundred Acres more or lese Graunted unto the said Susanna by patent bearing date the first day of Aprill 1686 **and** all that one half or moytie undivided of all that Capitall meynage or mansion late in the tenure of occupation of the said John Darnall deceased and now in the tenure or occupation of the said Henry Lowe situate lying and being on the south side of Patuxen River in Calvert County and
