The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above bound Charles Calvert his Heires Executors and Adm^r doe and shall well and truly performe fulfill and Keep all and every the Covenants, graunts articles and agreements contained and mentioned in Certain Indentures of bargain and sale indented bearing Date the day of the Date above mentioned, made betweene the said Charles Calvert on the one pt and the above named William Arbuckle on the other part, which on the pt and behalf of the said Charles Calvert his Heires
