To all Sheriffs Bailiffs and others to whom these presents shall come Greeting in our Lord God Everlasting Because we have understood by the Record of our Provinciaall Court of our Province of Maryland that John Cudston of Baltimore County in our said Province Taylor convicted and deteyned in the prison of St. Maries County for the Death of Dennis Garrett of which he was indicted killed the said Dennis Garrett by Chance and not by Felony or of Malice forethought We Moved with pity and Compassion have & doe by Vertue of these presents pardon and remitt unto the said John Cudston the said Manslaughter and granted unto him our firme peace thereupon soo that notwithstanding the said Manslaughter he stand in our Courts if any one will him thereupon implead Given under our great seal of our said Province of Maryland Witness our trusty and Well beloved Colonel Copley Esq. our Cap^t Generall and Govern^r in Chief in and over our Province and Territory of Maryland afo^r. this Twentieth day of April in the 4th year of our Reign &c. Anno Domini 1692.

This Indenture made the 23^d Day of Decemb^r in the 4th year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord & Lady William & Mary by the grace of God of England, Scotland, France & Ireland King & Queen Defend^r of the Faith &c. and in the year of our Lord Christ 1692: Between Colonel Copley Esq. Cap^t Gen^l Chief Govern^r & Vice Admirall of the Province of Maryland &c. of the one part and Robert Grundy of Talbot County Marin^r of the other part Whereas the Sheriff of Talbot County by Vertue of a certain precept from the Court of Admiralty of this Province to him directed bearing date the 12th day of October Anno Domini 1692. and thereby commanding & requiring him to expose & put to sale the shipps called the Anne of Newcastle now at anchor in Great Choptanck River with her boates and all her gunns rigging Tackel apperall Ammunition and furniture she being by due Course and tryall at law at a Court of Admiralty convicted and condemned for payment of the Sailors wages, NOW This Indenture Witnesseth that the s^d Colonel Copley by Vertue of the s^d precept afo^r for and in consideration of the sume of four hundred thirty one pounds five shilling good & lawful money of England or other wise well & sufficiently secured to be paid unto him in hand paid before the unsealing & sealing of the s^d Indenture and himselfe to be the s^d Robert Grundy his heirs &c. and every of them for ever by these presents fully clearly and absolutely Give Grant bargain sell &c. Confirm unto him the s^d Robert Grundy his heirs & assigns all that the Vessel or good shipps called the Anne of Newcastle now at anchor in Choptanck River and all the boates and other Vessells to the s^d shipps belonging or in any wise appurtening and all her gunns Tackel apperall rigging and furniture the s^d particulars annexed To have & to hold the s^d shipps called the Anne of Newcastle with all her boates & other Vessells and all and singular her gunns Tackel Rigging apperall Ammunition and furniture in the s^d schedule contained & specified to him the said Robert Grundy his heirs & assigns for ever
