Com. Letter to S^r Tho: Lawrence:

After Our Party Com. and advised, His Maj^t having graciously pleased by his
Lett^r Patents under the great Seal of England to grant unto you the Office and
place of Secretary of His Maj^t Province of Maryland in America there are
in His Maj^t name: and by His Express Commands to direct and require you —
and the Secretary of His Maj^t said Province for the time being to send unto us
a particular account of all things that shall pass or be transacted within ips^e —
said Office or Secretary and Express of such laws, acts of Government and publick
Orders as shall be made from time to time together with copies of the Journals
of the Council and all sum paym^rs as are or ought to be entered and registered within
y^e said Office to the end we whom His Maj^t hath appointed a Committee of His
Privy Council for trade and foreign plantations may be better enabled to —
perform the duty incumbent on us, which accounts and copies are to be transmitted
by you unto us quarterly or at such times in the year as any opportunity —
offer eth also Duplicates ther^e of by the next succeeding Postway unto such that
you and others whom it may concern may at all times glut due obedienti-
t^r unto you are to make entry of this Our letter in the Books belonging to yo^r —
said Office of Secretary wher^e you are not to fail: And we bid you a —
farewell, from the Council Chamber at White-Hall this twenty day of December
1692.
