By the Crowne Court 27th September 1692:

Upon motion made to this Court it manifestly appeared that Henry Lawrence of s^t Maryes County by force and Armes &c made forcible entry into and upon the peaceable and quiett possession of Elizabeth Connant Widow of and in a certaine Mesuage plantation and housing there upon situate Lyeing and being in s^t Georges Hundred in s^t Maryes County where in one John Addison lately dwelt and the same doth hold and unjustly detain, ordered, therefore by the Court that you John Watson and Edward Greenhalgh two of their Maj^{ties} Justices of the peace of the s^d County together with such power and strength of the said County as you shall see convenient take with you and enter into and upon the aforesaid housing plantation land and premises and take the same into your possession, and the same peaceable and quiett possession you surrender and deliver up unto Thomas Hebb to hold to him for the due use and behoofe of the s^d Elizabeth Connant and you the s^d John Watson and Edward Greenhalgh are hereby and by the s^d Court given full power and Authority to act and doo and about the premises as full & amply as by law you may or ought to doo
