Cumberland within the Kingdom of England Gent^l send greeting in Our Lord God Everlasting Know ye that I the
said Thomas Addison for sufficient cause & reasonable Consideration in here unto of specially moving heere
made & ordeined Constituted & in my stead place put & Deputie, & by these presents do make, Ordaine Constitute & in
my stead place put & Deputie Christopher Aglionby of the City of Carlisle in the said County of Cumberland Tobaccoist
my true & lawfull factor & Attorney for me & in my name & to my use to aske demand sue for recover & recover
of me from John Addison of St Georges in the County of St Maryes in the Province of Maryland Merchant the sum
or quantity of One hundred Thousand & four thousand Nine hundred pound weight nooth of good sound
Merchantable Leaf Tobacco Cask according to the Custom of Maryland aforesaid at the dayes hereafter mentioned
viz: Thirty four thousand pound weight nooth & Cask as aforesaid part of the said Tobacco at or before the
Tenth day of March next ensuing the date hereof, And the further sum or quantity of Seventy Thousand Nine
hundred pound weight nooth of the like good sound Merchantable Leaf Tobacco Cask according to the Custom
as aforesaid, Upon or before the tenth day of October which will be in the year of Our Lord God One Thousand Six hundred
Seventy eight at convenient place or places, where the said Tobacco & every part thereof may be loaded into Shipp
in order to the shipping thereof for England which said sum & quantity of Tobacco are due & belonging unto me the said
Thomas Addison my Ex^{or} adm^r & assigns as by Certain Articles & bonds under the hand & seale of the said John
Addison bearing date of with these presents doth & may more fully appoyne: And for default of payment of the
aforesaid sum or quantity of Tobacco, or any part or part thereof, or not doing & performing all & every
the covenants promises, & things whatsoever relating to the performing & paying the aforesaid sum or
quantity of Tobacco at the dayes & convenient places aforesaid, I the said Thomas Addison do hereby fully
authoriz & empower the said Christopher Aglionby to have, use & take all lawfull wayes & means whatsover
in my name or otherwise for the recovery thereof by attachment or otherwise according to Lawes of the
Country in Maryland aforesaid, & acquittance or other sufficient discharge for the same for me & in my name to make
soall & delivord, And to do all other lawfull acts & things whatsover concerning the premises as fully in every respect
as my self might or could do if I were personally present, & Attorney one or more under him for the purpose,
aforesaid to make & ordaine, & assigne at his pleasure & to execute, And I the said Thomas Addison do hereby
ratifie & confirme, whatsover my said Attorney shall, do or cause to be done in my name or otherwise by
virtue & force of these presents In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand & seale the Eighteenth
day of September in the third & Twentieth year of the Reigne of our Souveraigne Lord King Charles the second

Articles of agreement Indented made the Eighteen day of September Anno Domini One Thousand Six
Seventy Seven Between John Addison of St Georges in the County of St Maryes in Maryland
Merchant of the one part & Thomas Addison of Whitehaven Gent^l of the other part as followeth

Whereupon the said John Addison & Marke Cordoba have taken to freight the Good Shipp called the Lionpoule
Merchant of the Burden of Eighty Tuns or thereabouts (whereof Richard Windall is master) for a Voyage for
Six months certain & four months more uncertain at the rate of Sixty Six pound Sterling monthly by
a freight to be made from Dublin to St Maryes Quays in Maryland, & for back to Lionpoule (Ship or Goods
excepted to be discharged from the said Voyage as by Certain party of agreement Indented bearing date
