

Discovery of the prizes It is hereby also further ordered that the ^{Edward} Mann in the Commission he is to be impowred to sworne the ^{Edward} appraisors he be likewise thereby Authorized to call & cause to come before him the ^{James} Anderson and John Cape and all other persons having in their custody any of the ^{ships} Tackle apparell or furniture ^{be} to give and render an account upon their oaths to be Administred also by the ^{Edward} Mann of what part of the ^{ships} sayles rigging furniture ^{be} they have possessed themselves or how or to whom sold or disposed of and where the same are that for the same may be arrested and brought to the appraisors hereby before especially nominated and appointed and the ^{Edward} Mann is hereby also ordered after he hath sworne the ^{Edward} appraisors to deliver them their warrant and to give Notice to the ^{James} Anderson and John Cape of the time & place when & where the ^{ships} appraisment shall be made so that they or either of them may be then & there present if to them it shall seeme meete And for the better discovery and understanding of what is justly due to the ^{Comptrolers} for their ^{ships} wages and what days & places they were shipped at & at what rates by the Month by their Contracts with the ^{Charles} Cartis or any the Owners It is also hereby further ordered that the ^{Comptrolers} make oath before this Court to their severall Contracts & what wages is justly to them saw only Andrew Barnes who being not present in Court it is ordered that he make his oath touching the same before the ^{Edward} Mann And It is likewise ordered thereupon that the ^{Comptrolers} be paid their ^{ships} wages according to their oaths out of the product of the sale of the ^{ships} Tackle furniture ^{be} deducting thereout what disbursements the Merchant shall make appoyred to have payd unto them or any of them and lastly it is ordered and decreed that what of the product of the sale of the ^{ships} ^{be} shall remaine after the ^{Comptrolers} wages Damages and Costs payd discharged & deducted as aforesaid or what has been payd to the seamen as aforesaid by the ^{Edward} Cape being all made out of the Cargos the same shall be lodged and deposited in the hands of William Sharpe of Talbot County merchant here appearing for the interest of the owners for the use of the owners see the ^{William} Sharpe giving security to pay or be accountable to them for the same.

David Mills Sworne saith that he was shipped in Leith upon wages of 36^s 6^d per month the 23rd of Octobr 1690. & so continued till the 15th may following from thence was as Gunner to be allowed 50^s per month.

John Grose Sworne saith he entered into full pay as Steward aboard the ^{ships} the 26th September 1690. at 50^s per month.

M^r Cape alleages that he left order for the paym^t of five shillings due to the deponents wife w^{ch} he knoweth not but may be paid ordered that 20^s per month part of the ^{ships} 50^s be refered in M^r Capes hands to be made good to the ^{deponent} in case the wife have not received the same allowing also M^r Cape his Disbursements for same.

James Robertson saith that the 23rd day of October 1690. he was shipped aboard the ^{ships} Ann of Newcastle at 55^s per month of w^{ch} he receiv^d a month pay at home & some ac^t there was betwixt him & the merchant w^{ch} they must make upp between them that on the 30th January 1691. the Master Capt Cartis promised to make due money & allowe him a Crown more for pilotage.

Afterwards the Justices of the Court aforesaid did adjourn their Commission to the thirteenth day of December next and the same day was given to the parties aforesaid.

All which day came the ^{Comptrolers} by their procurators aforesaid & prayed to have their wages aforesaid Damages & Costs aforesaid ascertayned & paid the ^{ships} being appraisd and hath beene Exposed to sale & that the same may be to them secured by the purchasers.

And the ^{ships} appraisors made a Returne to this Court in a schedule of the goods & furniture ^{be} of the ^{ships} under the hand & seals of Andrew Tomard
