Thomas Boorman William Boxley, and Robert Grundy appraised
the 21: 22: & 23: days of November 1692: and certified that they had
valued and adjudged the good shipp Ann her standing Rigging as they
then were with all her guns Tackle Rigging apparel Ammunition & furniture
in the schedule mentioned to be worth four hundred two pounds and
eight shillings Sterling, And the Sheriff of Talbot County affd came here
also in Court and made returne of another prouyt to him directed from
this Court whereby he was commandad that when the shipp together
with all her guns tackle apparel Ammunition and furniture and all
Boates & Sloops to the same shipp belonging should be appraised and settled
by the appraiser as afof that he should take the afof shipp together
with all her guns tackle apparel Ammunition and furniture Boates and
Sloops therbelonging Condemned and to be appraised as afof and the same
and every part and parell therwof without delay in some Publick
place in the shire County exposed to sale to the best advantage of the owners
of the shipp as he could and the mony and produc thereof that
should arise by the sale of the shipp & her guns tackle apparel
Ammunition and furniture and the boates and Sloops to the same belonging
he was to keep in his custodie so that he should have the same at the
Court of Admiralty to bee held at the City of St Maries the 13th day
of December instant that thos Court might proceed to distribute
therer the same to such persons as by the shire Court is decreed for and in
satisfaction of their wages charges expences and Damages as afof and
that he should have therwritt to gather with the appraisement
& other thereto touching and concerning her the shire Sheriff by vertue of
thos writt did signifie to this Court That divers acknowledgements to the
shipp Anne were by the shire James Anderson Gaged & pledged to Robert
Bingle Merchant for the sume of 59⁴ 19⁴ Sterling appicular wherof
was therunto annexed therwritt appurtenances wth the shire shipp & the
residue of her furniture &c he had cause to be appraised as by a certaine
schedule to the shire writt annexed and that he had sold the shipp and
all her guns Tackle Ammunition Rigging and furniture as in the schedule
affd for the sume of four hundred thirty & one pounds one shilling &
six pence Sterling That is to say the sume of one hundred pounds ready
money payed and the residue by Bill of Exchange all whch he ready he
had affd as by thos writt was required and commandad

Whereupon this Court this present day proceeded to apporion the
wages due to the seafolke and their Damages to affre & the Officers charges
expended which amounted to the sume of 362⁴ 16⁴ 4⁴ as by afficular
account therwof herunto annexed may appear wth the sume of 362⁴ 16⁴
is to be paid or levied to be payed to the severall persons theron named
by the purchase of the shire shipp & the remaining part of the
produc of the shire sale being 68⁴ 5⁴ 7⁴ if John Groose wife haue
the 24⁴ 10⁴ deducted out of his wages to be lodged in the hands of the
Wm Sharp for the use of the owners upon his security as afof but in case
the shire Groose wife haue not received the 24⁴ 10⁴ then shall Wm Sharp
be also to give him security to be answerable to him the shire John
Groose for the same out of the shire ballance lodged in his hands as afof

Andrew Barnes the other pte made it appaard by his oath
that he was shipt the 14th of October 1690: at 9⁴ 5⁴ per month according
to which rate he was to be allowed his wages.
