

Thomas Boorman William Bexley, and Robert Grundy appraised the 21: 22: & 23: days of November 1692: and certified that they had valued and adjudged the good ship Ann her standing Rigging as they then were with all her Gunns Tackle Rigging apparell ammunition & furniture in the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ schedule mentioned to be worth foure hundred & one pound and eight shillings Sterling, And the Sheriff of Talbot County aforesaid came here also in Court and made returns of another proceet to him directed from this Court whereby he was Comanded that when the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ shipps together with all her Gunns tackle apparell ammunition and furniture and all boates & floops to the said shipps belonging should be appraised and gathered by the appraisors as aforesaid that he should take the aforesaid shipps together with all her Gunns tackle apparell ammunition and furniture boates and floops to her belonging Condemned and to be appraised as aforesaid and the same and every part and parcel thereof without delay in some Publick place in the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ County expose to sale to the best advantage of the Owners of the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ shipps as he could and the money and produce thereof that should arise by the sale of the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ shipps & her Gunns tackle apparell ammunition and furniture and the boates and floops to the same belonging he was to keep in his custody so that he should have the same at the Court of Admiralty to be held at the City of St. Maryes the 13th day of December instant that the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ Court might proceed to distribute & render the same to such persons as by the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ Court is Decreed for and in satisfaction of their wages charges & expenses and Damages as aforesaid and that he should have there the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ writ together with the appraisment & other thereto touching and concerning he the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ Sheriff by vertue of the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ writ did signify to this Court That Divers appentmentes to the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ shipps Ann were by the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ James Anderson haged & pledged to Robert Cogle Merchant for the sume of 59^l 19^s Sterling appentmentes whereof was therunto annexed the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ appentmentes wth the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ shipps & the residue of her furniture &c. he had caused to be appraised as by a certain schedule to the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ writ annexed and that he had sold the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ shipps and all her Gunns Tackle Ammunition Rigging and furniture as in the schedule be^{fore} for the sume of foure hundred thirty & one pound one shilling & six pence Sterling That is to say the sume of one hundred pounds ready money paid and the residue by Bill of Exchange all w^{ch} he had ready he had be^{fore} as by the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ writ two was required and Comanded

Whereupon this Court this present day proceeded to appoynt the wages due to the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ Comptrolers and their Damages to assist & the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ charges & expenses which amounted to the sume of 362^l 16^s 4^d as by appentment account thereof herunto annexed may appere wth the sume of 362^l 16^s 4^d is to be paid or secured to be paid to the severall persons therein named by the purchase^{rs} of the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ shipps &c. and the remaining part of the produce of the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ sale being 68^l 5^s 2^d if John Grose's wife have rec^{ed} the 24th 10^s deducted out of his wages to be lodged in the hands of the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ Wm Sharp for the use of the Owners upon his security as aforesaid but in case the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ Grose's wife have not received the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ 24th 10^s then that the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ William Sharp is also to give him security to be answerable to him the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ John Grose for the same out of the $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ Ballance lodged in his hands as aforesaid

Andrew Barnds the other $\text{\textcircled{P}}$ made it appere by his oath that he was shipit the 19th of Octob^r 1690: at 3^l 5^s per month according to which rate he was to be allowed his wages
