well beloved Sir Thomas Brouncker Knight of the shire of Middlesex Chancellor of the Exchequer
yett hath bene any most speciall care for the providing of Letters within or betwixt Virginia
Maryland Delaware New York New England East and West Jersey Pennsylvania Northward
and farr ad our Dominion and parts in America and that the want thereof hath bene a great
hindrance to the trade of those parts and the said Sir Thomas Brouncker hath bene desirous
not to grant unto him Letters Patent for the holding of such a Post at his owne charge and
working fully satisfied that the same may be of service to Trade and Correspondence and also
willing to encourage such an undertaking knowell therefore that wee of our Speciall
grace certain Knowledge and more motion and will and under the condition and agreement
herein after mentioned by the part and behalfs of the said Sir Thomas Brouncker the Executor
assigned to be performed have given and granted and by these presents for us our Heires and
successors doe give and grant unto the said Sir Thomas Brouncker the Executor and assignes
full power and authority to erect sette and establish and from time to time during the
termes therein after mentioned shall and may continue and enjoy within every or any the
said severall parts of the severall Islands Plantations or Colonys belonging or to belong unto us
our Heires or successors in America an Office or Offices for the receiving and dispatching
away of Letters and Packages with full power and authority and free liberty have and
exercise to and for him the said Sir Thomas Brouncker the Executor and assignes and to and
for such other person or persons as he or they shall from time to time in this behalfs nominate
or appoint at their severall Offices a forerand of and from any masters of shipped Passengers
or officers any Letters or Packages whatsoever which shall be brought into the said Colonys
and Islands or any of them from England or from any other parts whatsoever or whith
shall be sent from any parts or places of the said Colonys or Islands to any other
parts or places of the said Colonys and to dispatche away carry and deliver the same to the
respective persons and places to whom or within they shall be directed or sent within the said
Colonys and Islands or any of them and to take and receive to the only use and behoofe of the said
Sir Thomas Brouncker the Executor and assignes for the postage or carriage of the said
Letters and Packages and shall be soe dispatched sent away carryed and delivered
sett downe and aftertained in and by an Act of Parliament made in the twelveth yeare of the Reigne
of our late Royall Vnter King Charles the second Entituled an Act for erectting & establishing
a Post Office or Post Office rated or summe of money as the Parliament will freshly agreed
to give for the said Letters or Packages upon the first settlement of the said Colonys and
further wee have given and granted and by these presents for us our Heires and successors
give and grant unto the said Sir Thomas Brouncker the Executor and assignes and to such other
person or persons as he or they shall from time to time nominate and appoint full power
authority and free liberty have and exercise at the said Office or Offices to be settled ad
or bring to the same and to dispatche such of them away for England and shall be directed
with in by the first shipp that from time to time shall be bound for any port or town of
England to be there delivered to the deputy or deputyes of our Post master or Post masters
General for the time being by him or them appointed or to be appointed for the said port
to the General Post Office in England to be delivered according to the severall directions
directions of the same as by the said Act of Parliament is prescribed and to dispatche
away.
