 is inconvenient to our Subjects in General or that the power hereby granted or
 intended to be granted or any of them is or are abused that then it shall may be
 Lawfull to and for us our Heirs and Successors by any Order of a made in our or their
 Privy Council to revoke determine and make void the said Letters Patents and
 every thing therein contained and thing therein contained any thing to the contrary thereof in any
 wise notwithstanding provided further that if the said Thomas Neale his Exors Admors
 or assigns shall not within the space of two years next after the date of the said our Letters
 Patents establish the Post or Office hereby intended within the Colonies Islands and
 Plantations aforesaid according to the true intent and meaning of the said Letters
 then our grant and every power matter and thing therein contained shall be void
 any thing to the contrary thereof notwithstanding and the said Thomas
 Neale doth further for himself his Exors Admors and assigns Covenant promise
 and grants to and warrant our Heirs and Successors that all Letters or Parquets
 collected or received in any of the Plantations Islands or Colonies aforesaid to be sent
 for England shall from time to time be rare fully out up and dispatched away by
 the first Ship bound for any port of England to be delivered to the next Deputy
 Post Master in England without any charge to the Post Office there excepting and
 reserving unto us our Heirs and Successors that all Letters or Parquets the English
 Island Postage of all such Letters and Parquets last mentioned to be sent for England
 it being hereby intended and declared that the same shall not be accounted for the
 said Thomas Neale his Exors Admors or assigns but that he and they shall and is and are
 thereby obliged to satisfy and pay the Master of such Vessels for such Carriage and
 delivery of such Letters and Parquets as shall be sent for England as aforesaid and also
 that the said Thomas Neale his Exors Admors and assigns shall and will at
 his and their own proper cost and charge in the Colonies and appoint a sufficient
 Officer in our City of London to receive and roll up from time to time all Letters and
 Parquets for any of our Colonies or Plantations aforesaid and to take care to send
 them duly away from time to time by the first vessel bound for any of the said parts
 and further that all Letters commonly called State Letters which are usually carried
 postage free here in England shall pass free through all our Plantations and
 Islands aforesaid and further also that the said Thomas Neale his Exors
 Admors or assigns shall and will at the ends of the three first years next
 ensuing the date of the said Letters transmit or cause to be transmitted to the
 Comptroller of the Treasury or his Treasurer of England for the time being
 a true and faithful account in writing upon Oath of the whole profit and advantage
 arising or accruing by and the charge of holding and managing of the said Office
 or Offices herein before granted or intended to be granted or established and also
 shall and will keep true and faithful account in writing of all the receipts charges
 aforesaid relating to the said Office or employment and that from and after the expiration
 of the said three years next ensuing after the date of the said our Grants the like
 account shall be yearly transmitted as aforesaid if the same be required and for
 the better execution of the power and intention herein contained we have
 given and granted and by the said Letters our Heirs and Successors do give and
 authorize from time to time during the said term of twenty one years
 to set up make use and have ferry over any River or Lake in our said Colonies
 Islands or Plantations where no ferry is yett made nor any grants made
 made or given to any other person or persons by us or any of our predecessors
 for the better conveyance of postage and passengers and wood shall require
 and receive and take the profits and advantages coming or arising by such
 ferries to the use of him the said Thomas Neale his Exors Admors provided
 always and our will and pleasure is and was do hereby for us our Heirs and
 Successors declare that in all cases where such ferry or ferries are to be set up and
 made over other persons Land or Water the Proprietor or Proprietors thereof shall
 be first agreed with and his and their consent gained hereunto according to Law
 Justice In witness whereof we have caused the said our Letters to be made Patent
 Witness our self at Westminster the Seventh day of February in the fourth
 year of our reigns etc
