

This Indenture made the fourteenth day of November A: 1639 Between George Thompson of Salt Marys County in the Province of Maryland Gent: of the one part and Thomas Barton of the said County and Province Planter of the other Part Witnesseth that the said George Thompson for and in consideration of six thousand pounds of tobacco to him in hand paid be fore the sealing and delivering of this present by the said Thomas Barton Well and truly paid the Receipt whereof hee the said George Thompson doth hereby acknowledge and him selfe there with fully satisfied Contented and payd there of and of every Part and parcel thereof doth fully Clearely & absolutely Acquitt discharge exonerate and Release the said Thomas Barton his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns for ever and by these Presents hath Given Granted Alien'd Bargained Sold Enfeoffed and Confirmed and by these Presents doth fully Clearely and absolutely Give grant Bargain Sell Alien Enfeoff and Confirm unto the said Thomas Barton his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns for ever from him the said George Thompson his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns for ever all that Parcel of Land lying situate and being in the said County and Province aforesaid called the Trophy beginning at a Bounded Oak in the Wood the Northernmost bound here of a parcel of Land called the Myric Running thence South to be East Sixty four Perches to a Bounded Chestnut standing at the end of the North North West line of low Ridge and binding with the said Land West South West one hundred and sixty Perches to a bounded Chestnut of the said Land then South South East fifty Perches to a bounded Oak a Bounded tree of low ridge then West South West thirty Perches to a bounded Oak unto a parcel of Land called the Key formerly surveyed for the said Thompson thence North and by West with the said Land and Matopunis Old Road and to a bounded Road Oak on the North side of Charles Thongs Spring branch one hundred and fifty nine perches untill it intersects a parcel of Land formerly layd out for Mr: Barnet Jackson called the Addition thence with a straight line East fifteen degrees Northwardly to the first bound tree containing one hundred Acres more or less to be holden of the manor of West St: Marys with all and singular its Rights Juridictions and Appurtinances together with all houses Edifices Building Barnes Stables Hogs and Tobacco houses Orchards Gardens Yards Land tenements Meadows feedings Pasture Woods Underwoods Profits Commodities Common of Pasture Hereditaments and appurtinances whatsoever to the said Mesuage tenement or Premises or to any Part or parcel of the same belonging or in any manner of ways appertaining To have hold the said Parcel of Land and all and singular the Premises hereby granted bargained and Sold with their and euer of their Rights Members and Appurtinances whatsoever unto the said Thomas Barton his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns for ever and to his and their use and behoofe for ever & the said George Thompson for himselfe his heirs Executors and Administrators doth hereby Promise Avow Affirm Avow Covenant Grant and Agree to and with the said Thomas Barton his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns at the time of the sealing and delivering of this present that the said Land and Premises a good pure perfect Estate of Inheritance in fee simple is doth Affirme Alliage and Avow without any Condition reservation Remainder or Limitation of any use or uses Estates or Estates in or to any Person or Persons whatsoever to alter change defeat determine or make void the same and that the said George Thompson Bargain Sell Alien Enfeoff and Convey all and singular the before granted Premises with their and euer of their Rights Members Juridictions and Appurtinances whatsoever unto
