

Together with this Writ in Padrons to which with his said Sheriff did return into our Court of Chancery  
 an Inquisition taken at the aforesaid sum the two and twenty day of April last past and thereby  
 did certifie that the Juro: by him impannelled and sworn for the purpose in the said Writ mentioned  
 to wit Henry Denton Henry Taylor Daniel Mayham Parker Thomas Price son Richard Atwood Richard  
 Benton William Price Thomas Price Jun: Henry Lewis John Lanner and William Heath upon their  
 oaths did say that they rayed Twenty Acre of land to be run out on each side of the said river  
 and that it is not to the Damage of us our heirs or successors (2) That it is to the Damage of Mr. Land  
 Calvert Widow and relict of Mr. Phillip Calvert being Nine Acres, and worth by two year now as it is  
 without any further improvement Twenty pounds of Tobacco being taken out of two tracts of Land  
 (3) That it is to the Damage of the Lord Prop: Charles Lord Balloune being about Three Acre of the Mannor of  
 St. Johns and find worth by two years without any further improvement One pound of Tobacco / & That  
 it is to the damage of the City of St. Marys being One Acre of Towne land and being part of the hundred  
 Acre laid out into lots according to acts of Assembly of Building whereof thereon did find it worth by  
 the years without any further improvement One penny a year (4) That it is to the Damage of John Evans being  
 about Three quarters of an Acre and part of the Flappell land and worth by two years with the said  
 improvement One penny a year: (5) That it is to the Damage of the Flappell land being about half an Acre  
 without any improvement and worth by two years a halfo penny (7) That the rest being five Acre and three quarters  
 being Barrens and the bank of the river and it is to the damage of no person as by the said Inquisition remaining of  
 Norod in our said Court of Chancery may more at large appear And whereas after the said Lionel Capby had given  
 good & surely according to the true intent meaning and directions of the said Act of Assembly the beginning of the said  
 building of the mill to prostrate complete and finish by the time in the said act of Assembly limited & prescribed  
 Now know ye that we willing to encourage and promote the publick agod in pursuance of the said Act of Assembly  
 have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Lionel Capby his heirs & executors  
 and assigns the twenty Acre of land in the said Inquisition mentioned to be layd out in and near the City of  
 St. Marys on a Runn of Water called St. Peters or the mill run aforesaid to have hold and enjoy the said  
 Twenty Acre of land with all and every the profits commodities waters windwards and other the appurtenances to the  
 same belonging and appertaining and all houses and offices therupon built and erected to him the said Lionel  
 Capby his executors & assigns from the day of the date of these presents and during and to the full  
 end and term of fours score years from thence next ensuing and fully to be complete and ended together with  
 free egges and wrights to the said Water mill either by land through any maner land next adjoyning or else by  
 Water together with liberty to fall putt downe and carry away sit aye by land or Water any timber fit for building  
 of the said Mill other then timber fit to split into clapboards for and during the terms aforesaid according  
 to the true intent and meaning of the said Act of Assembly building and paying yearly during the said term  
 to the said Mr. James Calvert for the said Nine Acre of land in the Inquisition mentioned named per  
 capita or otherwise his heirs Executors Administrators or Assignes the rent or sume of Twenty pounds of  
 Tobacco at some convenient place in St. Marys County to the Right Hon: Charles Lord Balloune his heirs and  
 assigns being present possessor of Three Acre of land part of St. Mannor: the rent or sume of Sixty pounds  
 of Tobacco conuenient in the same County to the proportion of the city of St. Marys being present  
 possessor of one Acre of Towne land in the Inquisition mentioned the yearly rent or sume of One Penny  
 Sterling conuenient in the said City to John Evans his heirs or assigns being present possessor of one  
 acre of land in the said Inquisition named the yearly rent or sume of one penny Sterling conuenient  
 in the said City and to Mr. Francis Ponington his heirs or assigns present possessor of about halfe an  
 acre of the Flappell land in the said Inquisition after mentioned the yearly rent or sume of One halfe  
 penny Sterling conuenient in the said City of St. Marys: the first payment of which said yearly rent to be made  
 at or upon the five and twenty day of October which shall be in the year of our Lord God One  
 thousand five hundred Ninety and four and afterwards yearly and every year upon the said  
 Friday
