Sarah Boston fains and deposes as followeth (viz) that a paper her produced under the hand of William Hawley is a true and true paper to the purpose and intent therein contained the having from time to time safely kept the same through all difficulties and troubles John Cursey and William Luras was witness to the said deed and also further deposes that the said Wm Luras had under Sr: Mr: Hawley hand a paper to the same purpose and effect that the aforesaid writing was which the deponent well knoweth for that she heard the writing Luras had read over and it is as for their particular lands the very same as her husband's had and further saith that both these writings for the land of Sr: J: & Luras was done the same day and time and that quite after Mr: Nicholas Guyton came the same time from England the said Luras his house was first and was burnt down and as she very believeth the said writing burnt therein the said Luras making great complaint to the deponent saying his writings were burnt and that he had nothing to show for his land but did speak of getting witnesses sworn that knew the matter well which witnesses to the best of this deponent's remembrance were Mr: John Cursey who with the writing produced Mr: George Mowley Mr: Thomas Williamson Andrew Warner and Sr: Cursey & Maj: Cursey and further saith that the wages to be paid to Mr: Hawley by Sr: J: & Luras which this deponent knoweth for that Mr: Nicholas Guyton saith he did help to receive the wages for the purchase and did receive the same and after went over a branch and for the deponent's husband finding her again - she off her husband how Luras wages weighed he answered it out weighed his, but that was but part for Luras purchase for this deponent it well appeared that the remainder was paid the same day at the house of Andrew Warner which her husband then plainly told her the deponent further and further saith not
