

Lord Baltimore, yet I conceive that we cannot take away their majesties Right therein unless the Royall assent had been given to such Act which doth not appear to mee was ever obtained -

As to the last Demand in relation to Bills Bonds Records & other Writings belonging to his Excellency I conceive that the Bills & Bonds of the Trade as is affirmed to mee by the Lord Baltimore: that they are his Security for the Trade of Maryland agreed to be paid his Excellency by the Planters, upon his granting Land to them and that they were in his custody and seized and taken from his Treasury upon his Excellency being discharged of the Government. The fact being so I think it may be just and reasonable that they should be restored to his Excellency again and I do not see any prejudice can there by happen to the parties by whom such Bonds or Bills were given the said party have not executed their Warrants nor had forfeited returned for the Bonds cannot be put in suit till the Lord Baltimore: hath performed the Conditions on his part -

But I conceive it proper that the Records which are of publique use to preserve the Antient Lawes & Customs to their should be kept under the custody of the Governour -
