 firs for lawfull abbate & indeffigable Lised of and in the said Maner lands and  
 premises of inheritance in fee simple without any manner of fine or limitation or  
 other restance Matter or thing whatsoever to alter change charge or imparte disturbance or  
 make void the same And that the said Phillip Lynne and Margarot his wife or one of them  
 now have or have good right full power and lawfull authority to grant sell and convey the  
 said hereby bargained premises and every part thereof with their and every of their
