It Twenty days after sight of this my third Bill of Exchange my first nor second not paid pay or cause to be paid unto M<sup>r</sup>. Gerritt Vanfuringen or his order the sum of fifteen pounds Sterling being for Disbursements upon the Shipp Margreth's acct at time made good paym<sup>t</sup>. & please it to be acct. without further advice from M<sup>r</sup>. yo<sup>r</sup> loving Brother in Law George Luke To M<sup>r</sup>. Wm Stewart Merchant in London. Signed in Blank G<sup>r</sup>. Vanfuringen.

By this publick Instrument of protest Be it known and manifest unto all people that on the tenth day of the Month of August Anno Dni 1693 in the fifth year of the Reign of William and Mary King & Queen over England &c. at the request of John Taylor of London Merchant & Porten Paul Notary and Tabellion publick legally admitted and sworn dwelling in London speaking to William Stewart also Merchant of this City, I demanded of him if he would pay the Original Bill of Exchange of fifteen pounds Sterling (the Copy whereof is above written) he answered he would not pay the said Bill for want of Effort, Whereupon I the said Notary (at the request aforesaid) have protested as by these points I doo protest as well against George Luke Drawer of the said Bill as all others therein any ways obliged for Change & Exchange all Cost Damages and Interest suffered and to be suffered for want of payment of the said Bill. Thus done and protested in London in presence of Henry Smith and Thomas Jones Witnesses

I William Pine of St Marys County planter for a valuable consideration to me in hand paid by John Rowellin of the same County doe hereby assign, sell and sell over unto the said Rowellin all my Right Title and Interest of in and to a certain Mark by me here to be made up of and recorded or intended to be recorded for me in the Secretarys Office of this Province with all my Stock of Hogs Sow, Barrow, Boar and Piggs under the same (viz<sup>t</sup>) Copp and three Pitts on the Right Ear and Copp and Overhook on the Left. To have and to hold the said Mark and premises to him the said John Rowellin his heirs and assigns of his and their own proper marks or as before for ever (Howe Young theater being M<sup>r</sup>. Thomas Guyther's plantation whose mark to be forthwith altered and by three parts of five Barrow of the same mark all future Casualty or going to be allowed excepted) Witness my hand the 12<sup>th</sup> day of April 1694.
