

This Indenture made the Thuro and Twynth day of February Anno Dom-
 1693 Between Thomas Touch of New Brundoll County Esq. Administ. of the goods, shells
 & Goods of Howell Esq. Esq. of the one part and Christopher Quinn of Saint
 Marys County Planter of the other part Witnesseth that the said Thomas Touch for
 and in consideration of the sum of hundred pounds Sterl. to him in hand paid by the said
 Christopher Quinn, the receipt whereof the said Thomas Touch doth hereby acknowledge
 have devised leased and granted unto the said Christopher Quinn All that tract or parcel
 of land and plantation lying in St. Marys County commonly called potters plantation
 together with all houses gardens and Orchard therunto belonging to have and to hold
 the said tract of land plantation and houses unto him the said Christopher Quinn his
 heirs Executors Administ. or Assignes for and during the full term and terme of five
 years to comence from the last day of October thence fully to be computed ending
 & paying therefor yearly unto the said Thomas Touch one ear of Indian Corn if
 lawfully demanded And the said Christopher Quinn doth bounden promise and agree
 for himself his heirs Executors and Administ. to and with the said Thomas Touch his
 Executors Administ. and Assignes by their persons that he the said Christopher Quinn shall
 during the said term keep the aforesaid plantation houses and premises in good tenable
 repaired as he now repairs the same And the said Thomas Touch for himself his Executors
 Administrated do promise that the said Christopher Quinn shall have hold and enjoy
 the said plantation for and during the aforesaid term without any tax hindrance or
 molestation whatsoever from by or under him the said Thomas Touch his Executors Administ.
 or Assignes In Witness whereof the said Thomas Touch have hereunto set his hand &
 sealed the day and year aforesaid.

 Hayward for and in consideration of the sum of Eleven thousand pounds of tobacco to be
 in hand paid before the sealing hereof by the said Robert Mason the receipt whereof
 doth hereby acknowledge accordingly and himself therewith fully satisfied and thereof
 and of every part thereof doth clearly acquit and discharge the said Robert Mason his
 heirs Executors Administ. and every of them for ever by their persons hath given grant
 bargained sold aliened conveyed and confirmed and by their persons doth fully cleared
 and absolutely give grant bargained sold aliened conveyed and confirmed unto the said Robert
 Mason & his heirs for ever All that tract or parcel of land called Bloomerbury
 and lying upon Potomack River on the west side of Poplar hill lying on the East
 with the land of John Ward on the North with a line drawn Northward and by
 for the length of eighty perches to a marked Cape standing on the top of a hill
 the head of James Johnsons Runn on the west and south with the said John
 runn and Creek late in the possession of Thomas Layton containing and
