Know ye that John Thurber Commander of the Ship Philip of New York -  
Maryland by Matias Plantaron in America hath duly entered in this port  
the one and thirtieth of May last & the eighth inst of June & put on Land  
Two hundred and fifty three and a half in Bulk Maryland Tobacco being  
all the Goods and Merchandises taken in at his Matias said Plantaron in  
America and which hath been paid by Matias said Plantaron Additional duty  
in discharge of his Bond this Voyage taken by the Chief Officers at the port  
of Potomac in Maryland aforesaid and Certificate thereof dated the  
eighth of April last under the hand and Seal of the Honorable Collector  
Witness our hand & Seal of Office this eighth of June 1684 Anno R<sup>o</sup> 2<sup>o</sup> 2<sup>o</sup> 2<sup>o</sup>

Whereas I find that Information has been made against me W<sup>m</sup> Gaylard and  
Wilson that I should give out how that several papers have been found out of Bonds  
Bonds books in the Solitarys Office since their Removal to the Port Comptrol; these  
are therefore to certify that to the best of my Remembrance I should say that the said  
Office Records lay very in disorder on the floor and that some papers were lost and  
shattered and without speedy care be taken of these Records they might be more abused or  
to that purpose since which upon my Summary before the Governor the Governor  
ordered what I know in that matter Mr Henry Boulton Mr Henry Wrothley & Myself  
did go to the said Solitarys Office and made Inspection and particular Searching into  
the said Records and did not find any loose Quits since their Removal aforesaid  
the said Records being compared with the former list taken at S. Maries  
Witness my hand this 13<sup>th</sup> Day of March Anno D<sup>ni</sup> 1695

for Harbourage thereunto two hundred pounds for payment of eight thousand six  
hundred pounds of Tobacco valued the second Day of May 1684 & say paid by  
Mrs and I do hereby fully Release and Discharge the said M<sup>r</sup> Harman  
from all Records he had formerly given Me for the said Bond or any  
other papers Relating to the same
