 to the said two several parcels of Land belonging or in any wise appertaining
 or by the last writted Deed Relation being therunto also made plainly
 and at large appertaining And Wherof also the aforesaid William Turner
 and his wife by their other Deed of Bargaine and Sale or Conveyance
 under their hand and Seale bearing Date the Twentieth Day of March
 in the tenth year of the Dominion of the Right Hon^{ble} Charles the first our King
 in the year of our Lord God our Heavenly Father the hundred and Eighty for the
 purchase in the said good Memory of his great Alther Bargaine John
 Lubbock and his Invention unto the said John Galwith by him and Assignes
 for ever all that one hundred Acre of Land being part of the aforesaid Memory
 parcel of Land formerly granted unto Will Breunell and sold by the
 same of Breunell beginning at a Marked White Oak standing by Hunting
 Procks the first and going North North East one hundred fifty the first to
 a bounded White Oak and thence North West Eighty three paces and from
 the end of the North West line one hundred fifty the first South South West
 And thence South East to the first bounded brook containing and thence said out
 for one hundred Acre of Land More or less together with all highly profitfull and
 Benefitts therunto belonging (Royall Myne Excepted) or by the last Writted Deed
 Relation being therunto also made at large appertaining And Wherof also the
 said Right Hon^{ble} Charles the first our King by his other Letters patent under the great
 Seale then used in the said Province of Maryland for granting of Land thence
 bearing Date at St Marys the Eight and Twentieth Day of May in the first
 and Twentieth year of the Dominion of the said Right Hon^{ble} Charles the first
 Anno 1637 for the purchase therein mentioned Grant unto our
 Gracious George of parcel of Land called George Dofins lying on the North side
 of Subupaul River at the head of a brook called Hunting Procks on the West
 side of the said Procks beginning at a Marked White Oak by the side of the Main
 Branch of the Procks and running from the said White Oak North West fifty paces to
 a parcel of Land of James Willson bounded on the North with the said Willson
 Land for the length of one hundred and fifty paces bounded on the East from
 the end of the said line South East fifty paces to the Main Branch of the
 aforesaid Procks and the South with the said James Willson and his Invention
 and Invention of parcel of Land parcelled from the first Marked White Oak
 and thence said out for fifty Acre More or less together with all highly profitfull
 and Benefitts therunto belonging (Royall Myne Excepted) To have and
 to hold the same unto them the said Gracious George by him and
 Assignes for ever to be holden of his Majesty and his Invention as of his Majesty
 Manors pasture and in free and quiet Service by fealty only for all
