 Tracts of Land with the appurtenances in Maryland aforesaid
 by him the said John Galewith and his wife Made to
 the use of William Turner of Salvoe County aforesaid Gentleman
 therein named And for more evidence thereof the said
 John Galewith did now before us in Court And in the presence of
 certain Witnesses that have themselves subscribed their Names
 here and below at his Act and Deed to the use of the said
 William Turner the said Deed and prayed our Authentication
 thereof to effect therein contained **WHEREFORE** we do give this
 Attestation thereof and in further testimony have caused the Seal
 of the office of Mayorally of this City to be hereunto put and
 affixed Dated at London the third and twentieth Day of November
 Anno Domini 1694 And in the sixth year of the reigns of
 and Mary King and Queen of England

 Fox of Boston in New England Merchant for and in consideration of the Sum of
 Fifty two pounds four Shillings Sterling Money to me in hand paid & Granted
 to be paid by William Hatton of Prince Georges County in the province of Maryland
 have Granted and Released and for ever quit Claimed and by these presents
 doo for me my heirs and Assignes fully partly & absolutely Grant Release
 and for ever quit Claim unto the said William Hatton in his full and
 sole possession & Right & to his heirs & Assignes for ever all the
 whole Right title Interest Claim & Demand whatsoever which I the said
 William Fox now have or which I or my heirs at any time hereafter
 may or ought to have of in or to all the plantation or Tract of Land called Thomsons
 now formerly taken up and patented in Charles County but now by an Act
 of Assembly for dividing of County Territoria lying & being in Prince Georges
 County containing One thousand Acres more or less with all appurtenances
 therunto belonging or of right appertaining to have and to hold all &
 singular the Premises with their and every of their appurtenances unto
 the said William Hatton his heirs and Assignes for ever So that
 neither I the said William Fox nor my heirs nor any other person or
 persons for us or them or in their Names or Names right title
 or Demand shall or may by any way or means hereafter have Claim
 Challenge or Demand any whole right title or interest of in or to the
 said plantation or Tract of Land or any part or parcel thereof but from
 all
