This Indenture made the Eleventh Day of March in the first yeare of the Dominion of Charles Absolute Lord & Proprietary of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon Lord Baron of Baltimore &c. Annoq^{ue} Domini one thousand six hundred seventy and five Between William Guyther of the County of Saint Maries in the said Province Gent^l. on the one parts and Thomas Innes of the same County & Province Gent^l. on the other part **Witneseth** that the said William Guyther for and in Consideration of the full and Just sum of three thousand Eight hundred pounds of good sound Marchantable Tobacco in Casks to him in hand paid by the said Thomas Innes the Receipt whereof I doe hereby acknowledge and thereof and every part and parcell thereof doe hereby cleerly and absolutely Exonerate acquitt & discharge him the said Thomas Innes his heirs Executors Com^{rs} and assigns for ever by these presents hath given granted bargained aliened sold Enfeofed & confirmed and doth by these presents give grant Bargain alien sell enfeofe & confirm unto the said Thomas Innes his heirs and assigns for ever **All that** parcell of Land called and commonly known by the name of Joseph Calverts Plantation formerly in the Occupation of Roger Sterling lying situate and being in S^t. Broms Creek in S^t. Michadels Hundred in the County aforesaid **Beginning** at a point by the Creeks side running North till you come to a Cove and so up the Cove till you come to a bound (Adjunct from thence south till you come to a bound) then at the edge of the swamp and so run away west to a bound Pine Standing Standing by the head of a Cove and laid out for fifty acres more or less **And** also a parcell of land called Joseph Hackneys being joyning unto the said fifty acres **Beginning** at a Corner tree at the edge of the swamp and so running south till you come to the head of the Creeks ending and lying betwixt Henry Riders and the Swamp at the head of the Creek and laid out for twenty five acres more or less and also the timber trees that are in the swamp betwixt Henry Riders path, and the Dwelling house of the said Plantation Together with all houses Edified Orchards Gardens and all and singular the other appurtenances to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining **To have & to hold** the said parcels of Land and the bargained Premises to the said Thomas Innes his heirs and assigns for ever to the
