This Indenture made the 10th Day of October in the year of our  
Lord one thousand six hundred Ninety six Between William  
Hatton of the County of Gloucester Gentleman of the one part and  
Jm. Low of the County of Kent Ship Carpenter & George Dent of the same County  
Carpenter, Witnesseth that the said William Hatton for and in  
behalf of the said Jm. Low of the sum of five shillings to him paid by the said Jm. Low  
George Dent as for Divers other good Causes & Considerations him to be made  
more especially moving hath given granted bargained sold assigned  
transferred confirmed and by these presents doth fully  
clearly & absolutely give grant bargain alien sell transfer confirm  
confirm unto the said Jm. Low and George Dent their heirs & assigns  
forever all that parcel of Land called the Brothers Joynt Inters lying in  
Charley County in the woods about the way and beginning at a bounded  
white oak standing on the south side of a fresh run called Oxen Run  
thence south south east sixty seven furlongs ending upon a small Branch  
which cometh out of the Run to a bounded white oak thence west by south  
one hundred thirty seven furlongs to a bounded white oak thence south west  
seventy five furlongs thence south south west forty five furlongs to a bounded white  
oak standing on the south side of a great Branch thence west south west  
one hundred thirty seven furlongs to a bounded white oak standing on the side of  
a Hill, thence south sixty furlongs to a bounded white oak, thence south  
west by south thirty five furlongs to a bounded white oak standing in a  
Branch thence west north west Ninety furlongs to a bounded white oak  
thence north by west sixty furlongs to a bounded poplar thence bounded upon
