Lord one thousand six hundred Ninety Six Between William

Carpenter, Witneseth that the said William Hutton for in con-  
sideracion of the sum of five shillings to him paid by the said Jr. Low  
George Dent as for divers other good daughtours & children unto him and  
more especially movving hath given granted Bargained sold assynd  
Transferred Enforfed & Confirmed and by these presents to doth fully  
clearly & absolutely give grant Bargained alien sold Transfer Enforfed &  
confirm unto the said Jr. Low and George Dent their heirs & assigns  
forever all that pece of Land called the Brothers Joyal Intret lying in  
Charles County in the Woods above Piscatway and beginning at a bounde  
white Oak standing on the South side of a fresh run called Oxen Runing  
thence South South East Sixty Leaven fells bearing upon a small Branch  
which comys out of the Run to a bounde white Oak thence west by South  
one hundred thirty Leaven fells to a bounde white oak thence South east  
Leavenly five fells thence south west forty five fells to a bounde white  
Oak standing on the South side of a great Branch thence west South west  
one hundred thirty fells to a bounde white oak standing on the side of  
a hill, thence South Sixty fells to a bounde white oak, thence South  
west by South Thirty five fells to a bounde white oak standing in a  
Branch thence west North East Ninety fells to a bounde white oak  
thence North by west Sixty fells to a bounde poplar thence bounde upon  
the said Oxen Run as it runneth to the first bounde said containing and  
laid out for two hundred Thirtysix acres more or less together w<sup>t</sup> all dwelling
