

The Agreement between John Froul and Catharine his Wife

That after all the Debts of the sd John are paid and the Charge of all his legal  
 Law suits and particularly this late suit betwixt him and his wife defrayed there  
 shall be a division made of all the goods and Chattels and in a word the whole  
 Estate and Substances all the Lands Ties and Heres Roggs and other moveables and  
 Immoveables what soever of and belonging to the said John and that after such  
 Division of the sd goods and Chattels for which shall be into three equal  
 parts by two honest neighbours one to be chosen by the sd John and the other by  
 his said wife Catharine the said Catharine shall have one third of the  
 whole Estate to her share and her said husband two thirds and that upon the  
 receipt of the sd third part the said Catharine shall utterly leave and be  
 totally separated from the sd John her husband and provide for herself  
 Likewise that the sd John shall now forthwith and immediately upon de-  
 mand give and deliver up to his said wife Catharine one Gray Ward called  
 Jouney and her Coll as pt of her thirds and that he shall pay all his Debts and  
 the Charge of the sd suits within the space kind and breed of one year after  
 the date of these presents on Condition that the said Catharine do now forthwith  
 leave him and his house and provide for herself with wife our hands and Seals
