This Indenture 13<sup>th</sup> day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred ninety seven, A  
Between Jacob Harnis of Am Arrund in the Province of Maryland on the one part & Jacob Blangoy of  
Kent Island in Talbot County of the other part Witnesseth, that the said Jacob Harnis for & in consideration of the sum  
of ten thousand pounds of to be to him in hand paid by the said Jacob Blangoy at & before the signing & delivery  
of these presents the Receipt whereof the said Jacob Harnis doth hereby acknowledge & confess, that of every  
part & parcel thereof doth hereby & absolutely acquit, Exonerate, discharge the said Jacob Blangoy  
his heirs & assigns, every of them for ever by these presents, & for Divers other good causes & considerations  
him the said Jacob Harnis thereunto especially moving, hath given granted Bargained sold aliened  
confirmed & confirmed & by these presents doth fully freely & absolutely Give, grant, Bargain, sell, Alien  
Confirm and confirm unto the said Jacob Blangoy his heirs & assigns for ever, all that tract or parcel  
of land called Salthold Spring on the East side of the Chesapeake Bay in Cecil County, next adjoining to  
Land of John Underhill, Beginning at the said Underhills Southern most bounded tree, being an oak  
lying South Down the Bay for Breadth one hundred pearches to a marked Oak bounding on  
the South by a Line drawn East from the said Oak - for length three hundred & twenty pearches  
on the East by a Line drawn North, from the end of the East Line for Breadth until it Inter  
sect a parallel drawn from the Land of John Underhill on the North with the said Land &  
parallel, on the West with the said Bay, containing two hundred and fifty acres of Land &  
more or less, according to pattern granted to George Langhior in the year of our Lord one  
Thousand six hundred fifty nine, together with all singular, Boues & profits Comodi  
ties, hereditaments & appurtenances whatsoever to the said Land belonging or in any wise  
appertaining
