This whole Article wee look upon as reasonable for that the said Mr God and Kewling thought by his sent as Agents appeared there as Advocates for their Majesties and therefore might have had free Access to the Council board without any Charge or delay neither were they sent without Money or Credit proportionable to our Ability and their degree
