The Humble Petition of Phillip Lynes of this Province
To y^e hon^{ble} y^e Speaker and y^e rest of y^e hon^{ble} y^e members of
y^e Assembly most humbly Sheweth

That whereas upon the Arrival of his Ex^{ty} y^e late Govern^r Copley, y^e Petition^r being then
an Inhabiter and an Inholder at y^e Marys, at w^{ch} place y^e Govern^r Copley, by virtue of his
Maj^{ty} Commission looks upon him y^e Govern^r of this Province, Inord^r thereunto he hath himself
and Attendants at y^e Bishops house, to which place y^e said Govern^r called together all his Maj^{ty}
Council and other persons who had Administration of Govern^{mt} before his Arriv^l to give their Attend^{mt}
ance on him for publication of his Commission, and settling of y^e Govern^{mt} together also w^{ch} many
other officers military and Civil and some Troops of Guards to Attend his P^r. Ex^{ty} but happened y^e
petitioner being from home, notwithstanding y^e Pet^r wife w^{ch} y^e assistance of M^r. Thomas Gronwin,
did by y^e Ord^r of his Ex^{ty} and other Gent^l in Office as before mentioned, give Entertainment to y^e said
persons being then called down upon publique Affaires, both y^e Gent^l and their Attendants w^{ch} drink
virtually sates corn fodder for their horses, too that y^e P^r. Thomas Gronwin in hope and confidence of
y^e Publique Good will for y^e Bishops sake did Deliver and dispose of to y^e said persons in y^e best
horses w^{ch} shewed divers Liquors and accommodations, as by their severall Acc^{ts} drawne out in particulars
amounting to y^e sume of fifty two thousand nine hundred and nine pounds of Tob^o, all w^{ch} your pet^r
can make appear and prove by the oath of M^r. Thomas Gronwin who booked y^e same, afterwards to wit
in an Assembly held June 16. 1692. y^e Pet^r moved y^e hon^{ble} Assembly then sitting for satisf^{ct}
faction but his acc^t was of disbarment, as your pet^r then conceived, to be wholly upon y^e Publique
account, and thereupon y^e same was put to y^e vote of y^e house and it was then ordered that y^e said acc^t or
account should be charged to every mans particular Acc^t; So y^e great grievance of y^e Bishon^r y^e sh^o
your petition^r being made sensible of y^e P^r. boate, your petition^r being willing to get his just dues, was at
y^e charge and trouble of Copying out y^e particular Acc^{ts} in y^e best manner mentioned which referred to persons
living in most parts of y^e Province very remote from y^e petition^r - abode, and having such demands made, it
was returned your petition^r by most of them who was too charged, and more especially such as were in office
and fixated y^e great sh^o debts utterly denyed payment, asserting that they were called downe particularly
