

The report of Robert Jones Chirurgion concerning the Distemper that Mr Henry Denton, late Clerk of his Majesty's Council, here Died of is as followeth. I was sent for to Mr Denton who had been Sick nine Days before I was sent for to him, and he kept his bed three days of the same before I came to him when I came to him I found him Extream ill of a malignant fever and he had a very low pulse and his urine as in him of health which I have always observed to be a true Signum of a malignant fever, I can and doo truly say that I did give him the best remedies that I possibly could to the utmost of my Knowledge and Skill to remove the malignity of his Distemper but all my Care Skill and Endeavour did prove Ineffectual for the violence of his Distemper did gain upon him more & more Every Day notwithstanding all my Care and Industry in Looking after him till his Days was Ended by this malignant fever, which I solemnly Declare was his Distemper according to the best of my Knowledge to which I am ready to make oath according to the truth the whole truth and nothing but the truth -

This Indenture made the fifteenth Day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand Six hundred ninety and Seven Between James Rigby of the County of Ann Arundell of the one part and Abraham Johns of Calvert County and William Cole Jun^r of Ann Arundell County Gent^l of the other part Witnesseth that the Said James Rigby for and in Consideration of the Sum of one hundred and forty pounds Sterl. money to him in hand paid before the Enfealing and Delivering hereof by the S^r Abraham and William the receipt whereof he doth acknowledge and Doth clearly Acquitt Exonerate and Discharge the S^r Abraham Johns and William Cole their heires Ex^{ts} and Adm^{rs} of Every parcel parcell thereof by these presents halfe given grants aliened bargained and Sold Enfeoffed and Confirmed and these presents doo give grant alien bargain Sell Enfeoff and Confirm unto the S^r Abraham Johns and William Cole and to their heires and Assignes for Ever all and Every part and parcel of Two parts of Land Situate and Lying on Kent Island formerly in the County of Kent but now by an Act of Assembly in the County of Talbot The one Tract of Land taken up and Settled by Thomas Marsh and called by the name Copler neck Surveyed and Laid out for three hundred Acres more or less the other Tract of Land taken up and Settled by Thomas Bradnox and called by the name of Broadoaks Surveyed and Laid out for five hundred Acres more or less which S^r Two Tracts of Land joining together by S^r several means Assignments was made Settled and vested upon the S^r James Rigby who upon the thirteenth Day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand Six hundred and Eighty obtained by Grant from the R^{ty} hono^{ble} Charles Earl Baron of Baltimore Absolute Lord and Proprietary of this Province that the Said Two Tracts of Land called by the name of Broadoaks and Copler neck should be Surveyed and laid out in one Inlie Tract and that the Said James Rigby should have the Surplus Land of the Said two Tracts which Said Two Tracts of Land by virtue of the Said grant was afterwards upon the thirteenth Day of August in the Year of our Lord one thousand Six hundred and Eighty and two by William Barker Deputy Surveyor of Kent County Surveyed and
