This Indenture made the one and twentieth day of February in the second year of the Dominion of the Right Honble Charles Lord Baltimore or Chiefe Domini our thousand five hundred seventy five between Wm Medley of Maryland in the County of Saint Marys in the Province of Maryland planter on the one part and Stephen Murry of the County of Saint Marys on the other part Witnesseth that the said William Medley as well for and in consideration of the full quantity of twenty thousand pound of good sound Merchantable Tobacco in Cash well and truly paid him or to be paid as a part for sundry other good cause and consideration him therein moving hath given granted aliened bargained and sold and by these presents doth give grant alien bargain and sell unto the said Stephen Murry all that tract of land lying on the East side of Driftons Bay near the head thereof beginning at a marsh by the Bay side called the Indian Spring bounding on the East with a Line drawn from a marked Oak standing upon the said Spring North into the woods for the length of Six hundred verges, on the North with a Line drawn west from the end of the former Line into the fresh run of the said Bay on the South and west with the said run and Bay containing by estimation one thousand and one hundred Acres more or less. Excepting one hundred Acres of land part of the said Driftons Bay near the head thereof sold and granted and now in the possession or occupation of John Browne together with all that his water Mill commonly called or known by the name of Driftons Bay Mill, and all and singular Tradewayes and Mill ponds coveres, rivers, fishing places, wayes, paths, passages, easements, profits, commodities, advantages, emoluments, appurtenances whatsoever to the said Mill and other the premises by these presents granted or any of them, or to any part or part thereof of incident belonging or appurtenance, together also with all and singular the houses, edifices, building yards, gardens, fields, woods, thuds, woods, ditches, springs, writings, and Emoluments to the said one thousand Acres of land belonging or any wayes appurtenance to the said one thousand Acres of land and to hold the said Tract of land and Mill and all other the premises with their and every of their appurtenances, before by these presents bargained and sold, or meant or intended to be thine by granted, aliened bargained and sold, or meant or intended to be thine by the said Stephen Murry his heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, assigns, and assigns forever. To the only, proper use and behoof of him the said Stephen Murry his heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, assigns, and assigns forever. And the said William Medley for him self his heirs, assigns, executors, administrators, assigns, and assigns forever.
