his greatest misfortunes of his life to be brought under the Circumstances he is at present. god Undoubtly much as
thereby he is found guilty of abusing and rebelling against not onely Dignified as the character w. q. Ex'p before
in his Province under his Saide May. but likewise against whose ears prudened, Diligently & Circumspic
has brought v. Fram of this Governm't to such affliction, and promoter acts of Justice and fury, to that degree
therin as may Justly Deserve & regele and prayers for q. Ex'p long continuall in v. Governm't of all
parts well affected to their King and Country.

And as your Ex'p humble petitioner from the bottom of his heart, is sorry not only for his said misfortune
but also for his offend given your Ex'p looks sincarly promised never again to give the least accusation either by
writing Company or aney Disaffection or persons to your Ex'p or otherwise of his falling again under your
Ex'p displeasure; and this as he is a Christian doer declare that none of his actions was ever thought or
intended to thin aney manner of felonie in your Ex'p Governm't & hoping this being his first offend ag.
q. Ex'p that you will be too favourable to extend your Clemency so far towards him as he is well

confirm your Ex'p in v. belief of your Petition v. Sincerly in this matter he humbly offers to deliver into your Ex'p
very Original copy late articles framed by m: John Good and Son in his own hand, who is v. main Instrument
of your Petitioners present misfortune and who for Company and Correspondence your Petitioner for his own safety
for v. future abys, and as much as your Ex'p humble Petitioner has his Sincerly and in all humblye left
himself to your Ex'p mercy, and has offered to do any thing in his power and know ledge, that may in any wise conduce to your Ex'p Satisfaction, he humbly hopes your Ex'p goodness will see farre & stand aslo remitt punit
due to his guilt, and remitt him to god hand and mind his owne private affair as for v. future Shall be v. only this
