any thing the Def. in his yole alldges he ought not to be discharged of his auon: for the said
woman Servant Alice was then the proper Servant of the said D^r S^r and not Servant
of his the said Robert and this he knowes and thereupon puts himself upon the Court

Whereupon the witnessess sayed for the p^t w^e called who being duly sworn and
examined deposid as followeth viz

First of her Bridgewater aged 29 y^r aye sayth that Thomas Bland upon a
Saturday night, togather with a woman Servant called Alice, coming to the houe-
of Robert Proctor the said Thomas Bland would haue sold the said Servant to M^r Proctor
and desir'd M^r Proctor to kee the said Servant and look after her But that M^r Proctor
was unwilling she shold stay in the houe and would haue had M^r Bland to haue taryed her
away again. And this deponent further sayth that the next morning the said M^r Bland
would neare sell the said woman Servant, whiche M^r Proctor and his wife would or no, And
that the said Bland fitchid two Bottles of wine and said he would haue that wine for the servant
to w^e M^r Proctor Replied that M^r Bland shold pay for the same and when the said M^r
Bland was going from the houe M^r Proctor would haue had him to haue taken back to take
the said Servant along with him But that M^r Bland would by no meane take away the said
Servant But left her there and desir'd M^r Proctor to kee her a month promising her
a hogg^d of Tobacco and that she shold haue the said Servant for her paym^t. And this
deponent further saith not.

Alice Borroughs aged about 24 y^r aye sayth that M^r Bland above mentioned
said he would give a hogg^d of Tobacco to M^r Proctor if she would haue the woman Servant
about mentioned for a mouthed and that if she did haue her she shold haue her for nothing And
this deponent further sayth not.

Juni Duror aged about 21 y^r aye sayth that att the tyme above mentioned
M^r Bland come att M^r Proctors houe Brought out two Bottles of Wine, And said, I will
drinke for her however incouyng Alice sayer the woman Servant about mentioned and upon
his saying that he would haue the said Servant with this deponente Missis her M^r Proctor,
she would haue nothing to do with her and therupon M^r Bland said if you will haue her a
mouth you shall haue a hogg^d of Tobacco and if she did well att the mouth End the missis
should haue her like wife for her trouble. And this deponent further sayth not.

Then w^e the witnessess for the D^r affo called who being Duly sworn and
examined deposid as followeth viz

George Brabant Servant to Thomas Bland aged about 25 y^r aye sayth that
M^r Bland (his master) Brought downe Alice sayer on a saturday night to Robert Proctor
and would haue sold her to him But that in Regard she was udry ill M^r Proctor was loath
to buy her. And M^r Bland demanding 800^l £ 80 baus for the said Servant M^r —
