That whereas the said Walter Dunch by George Parker his Attorney Complaynteth that whereas the said William Dorrington the fourteenth day of February One thousand six hundred seventy eight paid into the said Walter Dunch in the full sum of one hundred and twenty pounds Sterling money of England being the Remainder of three hundred pounds Sterling money contracted between the said Wm Dorrington and the said Walter Dunch as the portion of Mary Johnson the said wife of the said Walter Dunch and Daughter of John Johnson the said wife of the said Wm Dorrington In Consideration whereof the said Wm Dorrington did assure upon himself and to the said Walter Dunch did faithfully promise when the same required the said sum of one hundred and twenty pounds Sterling money would and duly should satisfy and pay notwithstanding the said Wm Dorrington his promise Dunch in this behalf rashly and subtilly to deceive and defraud the said sum of one hundred and twenty pounds Sterling money Although of the said Walter Dunch hath not paid nor satisfied according to his promise and assurance afore said but the Dunch whereupon he saith he is Damaged and hath lost to the value of two hundred pounds Sterling money of England and thereupon he brought his Suit

That the said Wm Dorrington by Robert Ridgely his Attorney Comith and defendeth the force and injury which he saith that as to the said sum of one hundred and twenty pounds Sterling money in the declaration in duce he hath nothing to say in Barre of the action of the said Walter Dunch but that he should remove the same against the said Walter Dunch Remageth against the said Wm as to the said sum of one hundred and twenty pounds Sterling money undifended therefore it is considered of by the Court this day to wit the seaventh day of March in the fourth year of the Dominion of Charles the second King of Great Brittain that the said Walter Dunch do Recover against the said Wm Dorrington the said sum of one hundred and twenty pounds Sterling money with costs of Suits and the said Wm in money &c
