

To the Right Honorable Thomas Mordaunt Esq. Lord Justice and Chief Justice of Maryland and the Rest of his Associates Justices of the Provincial Court.

This is humbly to certify your Honor that by virtue of a Commission issued out of the said Court bearing date the Tenth day of October 1678 Directed to your Honor Thomas Mordaunt Esq. Richard Ladd and Charles Botcher Gentlemen to hear and determine all matters and differences in Question between Job Nutt Plaintiff and Henry Jowles and Sybell his wife Executors of William Groom deceased Defendants in one Motion of Law depending between the said parties and also in one Suit in Chancery between the said Henry Jowles and Sybell his wife Executors of the said William Groom pt. and Job Nutt and Michael Tauney Defendant by virtue of which Commission we or any two of us should meet at such time or times and place or places as to us or any two of us should seeme fit to hear all such Arguments Arguments Debates proofs Evidence and witnesses as by the said parties aforesaid or their respective Attorneys should be produced before us whereby the truth of the matter in Controversie between the parties aforesaid should be made more manifest unto us we had in this presence of Christopher Kenby Gentleman and Michael Tauney Attorneys of Job Nutt and Henry Jowles and Sybell his wife Executors of William Groom as aforesaid and Robert Carville Gentleman their Attorney considered the true merits of the matter in difference between the parties aforesaid and have heard and read the proofs Allegations accounts documents Charges and discharges which were produced before us And upon the whole matter and serious advise and Deliberate Consideration of the premises we do order Judge and determine as followeth (viz)

First that the said Henry Jowles and Sybell his wife Executors of William Groom aforesaid do well and truly Deliver unto the aforesaid Job Nutt his Attorney or Attorneys Eighteen Cows, fifteen Calves, one Bull of four years old four Cattle of two years old each five Steers of three years old each, two Sows, two Barrows, one Boar, henns and poultry and severall household goods mentioned in a Schedule hereunto annexed all or before the tenth day of January next ensuing the date of these presents And we do further order Judge and determine that the aforesaid Michael Tauney Attorney of the aforesaid Job Nutt shall upon due notice given by the aforesaid Henry Jowles or his order be ready at the aforesaid plantation of the said Job Nutt to take and receive All and every the aforesaid Cattle hogs poultry and household goods to be delivered by the said Henry Jowles and Sybell his wife as aforesaid and to give Receipt unto the said Henry Jowles and Sybell his wife as aforesaid and to give Receipt unto the said Henry Jowles and Sybell his wife as aforesaid and to give Receipt unto the said Henry Jowles and Sybell his wife as aforesaid and to give Receipt unto the said Henry Jowles and Sybell his wife as aforesaid

Secondly we do order Judge and determine that the aforesaid Henry Jowles and Sybell his wife Executors of William Groom as aforesaid do make full and discharge unto the said Job Nutt his Attorney and Attorneys Assigns and assignes one good and sufficient Release and discharge of and from all Bargaines Contracts Leases agreements Bills Bonds writings and demands whatsoever And also from all and all manner of errors or wrongs whatsoever in the Suits above specified And also that the said Michael Tauney Attorney of the said Job Nutt or either the Attorney or Attorneys of the said Job Nutt for the time being do upon the performance of all and singular of the orders Judge and determine aforesaid make full and discharge unto the said Henry Jowles and Sybell his wife Executors of William Groom as aforesaid one good and sufficient
