 part of a tract of Land called Crag pasture lying in
 Dorsetshire exactly on the south side of Great Cragbank
 over beginning at a marked oak standing at the
 mouth of a Creek called the Lower Creek and running
 from thence up the Creek for breadth easterly and for
 length and from thence by a line drawn south for
 length three hundred and twenty paces bounding on the
 north by a line drawn from the end of the south line
 west easterly and for paces to the head of the Lower
 Creek bounded on the west with the said Creek
 for the length of three hundred and twenty paces
 to the first marked oak bounded on the north with
 the said Creek and on the east with the said south line
 containing one hundred and fifty acres of Land with
 together with all the rights profits privileges and benefits
 thereunto belonging or in any way appertaining
 and also all writings deeds patents and orders
 touching or concerning the same to have and
 to hold the aforesaid parcel of Land and premises
 with all and singular the appurtenances therunto
 belonging hereby sold or mentioned or intended to
 be sold as parcel or member thereof unto the
 said Letters Patentes his heirs and assigns
