day and that every respected sonne that
comes to the age of twenty one years
I shall pay to my said ^{two} friends each of
them a hundred in God and if any of my
sonnes prove refractory and will not be ruled
by my said two friends and their brother
Edward that then my said two friends and
their brother shal thin or them out of the
some handy craft trade untill they
they attain to the age of twenty one
years as witness my our hands and seals
the day and yeare first above written
