This Indenture made the fifteenth  
Day of October in the Thirtieth year of  
the Reigne of our Sovereign Lord William  
the third by the grace of God of Eng Land  
Sutland France and Ireland King Defend  
of the faith &c Between John Manby  
Nephew Heir at Law and Devisee of  
Hugh Manby Late of Calvert County Gent  
Deceased of the one parte and Captaine Tho:  
Dixon of Somerset County planter of the other  
parte **WITNESSETH** that whereas the  
Rt Hon<sup>ble</sup> Caullis Lord Barron of Bellenmore  
in the year of our Lord 1663 by his Letters  
Patents under his greater Seale at court  
did Grant unto the said Hugh Manby a parcel  
of Land Lying on the Eastward Shoar of  
poconock River on the Easternmost Side of  
the said River Beginning at a marked  
oak Standing by the River Side Close to a  
Marsh that runn out of said River into a  
Creek called Manbys Creek and running  
North and by East up the said River the  
Breath of six hundred Seventy five perches  
to a marked oak Standing on the Bank of  
the said River with a Line Drawne East  
and by South the Length of Three hundred  
and Twenty perches thence with a Line  
Drawne South and by west Down the  
weir to a marked Pine Standing by  
Manbys Creek Side the Breath of six  
hundred Seventy and five perches thence
