Sonne and Heir then under the age of one and twenty  
years and about March 1683 the Said Dan<sup>l</sup> Devins  
also dyed having made his will in writing & therein  
amongst other bequests did Devise his Lands goods and  
Chattels after the Decese of Ann his wife & will the Same  
to be Equally divided amongst his Three Daughters Kester  
Mary and Martha & in case of any of thers deaths the  
Survivor to have all & the Said Kester & Mary being dead  
without Issue & the whole Title & Interest of the Said Land  
called Scotland being descended to the Said Martha since  
married to the Said Zacharias Vanhoorngon & the S<sup>d</sup>  
Charles Calvert being since because of full age & being  
willing to Confirme unto the Orphants of the Said Daniel  
Devins the Contract & Agreem<sup>t</sup>: made by his S<sup>d</sup> Father w<sup>th</sup>  
the Said Daniel Devins upon the Exchange aforesaid  
and having long before the Time that the Said Charles  
Calvert sold & parted w<sup>th</sup> his Interest in & to the Said  
Mannors to Philip Lynes Resolved out of his Sale the  
Said Land called Scotland and other the Lands within the  
Said Mannors by his Said father or by him the S<sup>d</sup> Charles  
Calvert sold or agreed to be sold to any p<sup>sons</sup> whatsoever &  
Particularly having on the behalfs of the Said Orphants  
of the Said Devins promised to make unto them or the  
Survivor of them a good & firme Convoiance of the Said  
Land called Scotland to them & their heirs for ever according  
to the Said Contract & Agreem<sup>t</sup>: made by the S<sup>d</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Calvert  
and the will of the Said Daniel Devins Now this In-  
denture further Doth Wittness that the Said Charles  
Calvert for the severall Consideracon. aforesaid & for and  
in Consideracon of the Summe of five Shillings of Lawfull  
money of England to him in hand paid by the Said
