by these presents Sealed with my Seal  
Dated the three and Twentieth Day of  
Octob<sup>r</sup> Anno Dom<sup>i</sup> 1700

Whereas The above bound Thomas Carvill being an  
-tient and in firm of minded and fully intended to make  
a good and competent provision for the maintenance  
and supports of his present wife Susanna (in case  
she should survive him the said Thomas) for and in  
consideration of the Love and affection he bears unto  
her and in acknowledgment of her great care and  
tenderness towards the said Thomas Carvill her husband  
and of his affairs now in his declining age and in  
reputation of her future care Diligence and good  
behaviour towards her said Husband NOW THE  
CONDITION of this obligation is such that if the  
said Thomas Carvill Do or shall at the time of his  
Death Leave unto his said Wife Susanna (in case  
she survive him) the full sum and just quantity  
of forty thousand pounds of Tobacco of good sound  
Merchantable Tobacco to have and to hold the same unto  
her the said Susanna from the Death of the said  
Thomas and to her assigns for ever for and towards
