

Witnessed That on this 21st day of August 1703 Mr James Lewis & Mr Leonard Weyman at the request of Wm Bateman & Thomas Gasaway Came upon a certain Tract of Land belonging to the said Bateman called Poplar Ridge adjoining to a Tract of Land belonging to the said Gasaway called the Gardens &c. In order to give relation of the Ancient moor & bounds of the said Tract of Land called Poplar Ridge which in the presence of Henry of the Neighborhood & Thomas Parkin Surveyor did show some bounds & trees of the said Land and did then & there relate that the Ancient moor & bounds of the said Land to wit as followeth as by them prescribed (That is to say) Beginning at the end of two hundred & seventy four perches in the East & by North fence of the said Bateman his Land then was as by the above mentioned Evidence formerly done to be the Intersection of a tract of Land called Shaws Tolly to the original Court relates to then instead of running North one hundred fathoms we extended one hundred & twelve fathoms to a small bounded plummer standing near the spot where the ancient boundary appeared to stand then instead of running East seventy five fathoms it appeared to be but twelve fathoms to the boundary at the end of the said East fence & then instead of North one hundred fathoms we extended but forty two fathoms where we met with the draught of a branch where appeared by the above said Evidence to stand the bounded Tree at the end of the said fence where now by the consent of both the above said parties (Conrad is a bounded Tree) standing by the side of the said Branch and then instead of running West one hundred fathoms to a bounded Tree as mentioned in the original Court we ran but sixty eight fathoms to the said Tree it being proved by the above Evidence to be the original Tree standing at the end of the west fence then by a line drawn Correspondent to the ancient Court fence South by East eighty fathoms to a pair tree standing where formerly stood the original Boundary of a Tract of Land called Berrington which the original patent relates to the same being the bounds that say ambiguous between us the subscribers and now being proved to both our satisfaction we do hereby oblige our selves our heirs & assigns for ever hereafter to stand to & abide by the said Bounds & releasing & relinquishing all manner of Claims or Claims whatsoever to each other our heirs & assigns for ever of any other bound or bounds which we or either of us have or had or have unto set our Lands & Toals the day & year first above written
