An Act for the Relief of the Creditors & Legatees of Maria Cordoe late of
 St. Marys County dead.

Whereas at a Session of the County begun & hold at the City of St. Marys the
 twentieth day of September in the year of our Lord 1694 the Creditors of the
 said Maria Cordoe by their humble Application to his Excellency & Councils Deputes
 in that Assembly sitting shew that about the year of our Lord 1669 one Walter Hall
 of the said County Gent & the said Maria Cordoe did joyntly purchase of one John
 Murrell two several Tracts of Land called the Great Manns & Elizabeths Manns in
 St. Marys County and the conveyance whereof was taken in the name of the said Walter
 Hall only but for their uses after wards to wit about the eighth day of Aug
 1670 the said Walter Cordoe entered into Articles of agreement in writing &
 reading the said Joynt purchase of Murrell they covenanted with each
 other that the said Tracts of Land should be equally divided between them
