

That the Council for the right hon<sup>ble</sup> the right hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Proprietary  
 deriving me to be heard heard therein & that the passing of the said bill  
 might be suspended till such time as they could write to the Lordships above  
 this case they supposing the tobacco had been purchased by London  
 before his Naturalization or upon some other account for want of time  
 of Walter Hall doct in which estate should be in litigation then remaine  
 by the purchase from the said estate It was thereupon ordered that the  
 said bill should be reported to the next session of  
 assembly afterwards to wit about Michaelmas 1695 the said petition  
 for the said bill particularly the petition of Am<sup>ble</sup> Henry Locout doct what folies  
 & facts the said London had married some of them being unpaid their portions  
 for the paym<sup>t</sup> of the said Gerret Vanwoerengen & James pattison of  
 Marys County as having married the folies & facts of the said Walter Hall  
 who was also bound with & as security for the said London to pay the said  
 childrens portions to the Lord prop<sup>r</sup> in one hundred & fifty thousand pounds of  
 Tob<sup>o</sup> & the said petition & have since obtained judgm<sup>t</sup> ag<sup>t</sup> the said pattison &  
 Vanwoerengen on that bond they requested Rob<sup>t</sup> Carville who had before  
 solicited for the passing the said bill to take the said papers & writings relating  
 to the said London & to give and deliver as afo<sup>r</sup> & to further & promote  
 the passing the same & that this house on the return of the London shal be  
 which time it was presumed they might hear from the said pattison  
 And the said Robert Carville having recd from the said pattison & Vanwoerengen  
 certain writings bound up together in which were contained the original & the  
 original Writing & Division made between the said Walter Hall & Maria  
 London as afo<sup>r</sup> & two bonds of the said bonds for performance of conditions in  
 the said bonds containd from one John Barnes of the same County for the  
 conveyance of the certain Tracts of Land part of the said Mann<sup>r</sup> bought by  
 the said London of the said Barnes for 33000<sup>l</sup> of Tob<sup>o</sup> truly paid by London to  
 Barnes & some other writings & conveyances with intent to bring  
 Annapolis to produce the same in order to the passing the said bill  
 Carville by an unhappy accident lost his bagg of writings in which were  
 the writings afo<sup>r</sup> as by the several Affidavits hereto annexed may more  
 plainly appear. & that the same writings not being recorded in the prov<sup>o</sup>  
 of County Court the said Court will be at a great loss about the said if not relieved  
 herein by act of assembly to give title to trustees to be appointed to sell the  
 said Lands for paym<sup>t</sup> of the Tob<sup>o</sup> afo<sup>r</sup> for which they are become gualter
