I Doe hereby promise for me and my heirs to Barrett Mercury that in case that he upon the plantation where he now is doe well manage all such lands as I shall putt under him in making a crop of Indian Corn and Tobacco with other necessaries upon the said plantation and that hee shall take care to raise a stock of Hogs and Cattle upon the said plantation and doe all other things necessary for the well improvement of the said plantation and doe also make for his particular share and part Twenty thousand pounds of good Tobacco to be raised upon the said plantation within the space of five years now next beginning the Date hereof, the years I mean that is to say the Crop that is now in the house to be accounted as one of the five years Crops that then the said Barrett Mercury shall be a freeman and so discharge from my service with my hand this Twentieth Sixth Day of October one thousand seven hundred and three
