

The said Examination being made in relation to cause depending  
in the provincial Court between Leonard Holiday and Orphan  
of Thomas Greenfield Esq. his Guardian and Estate Plaintiff &  
Hugh Adley Defendant is at the prayer of the said Defendant  
recorded as follows. viz:

In Obedience to a Commission from the High Court of  
Chancery dated the Eighteenth of February last Em-  
powering us to Examine evidences concerning the bounded trees  
of two tracts of Land called upper Quitting & Fewksbury,  
belonging to the Orphans of Colonel Thomas Hollyday  
we did this day call before us Colonel Nicholas Beall  
who made Oath upon the holy Evangelist that, a burnt Stump  
of a white Oak (at w<sup>ch</sup> Stump he then was), was marked for the second  
bounded tree of upper Quitting, also the second bound tree of  
Fewksbury & was the North East bound tree of Scotts lot,  
also the second bound tree of Dundee, & the first tree of  
Tho: Plumers Land near to w<sup>ch</sup> Stump stands a white  
oak bounded by M<sup>r</sup> Clem: Hills standing in the first  
line of upper quitting

Also the said Colonel Beall carried us to a dead white oak  
standing on Collington, w<sup>ch</sup> he deposed was the first bounded  
tree of Fewksbury and the third bound tree of upper Quitting, w<sup>ch</sup>  
tree being dead M<sup>r</sup> Thomas Greenfield bounded a small  
white oak w<sup>th</sup> four Notches on two sides, being about five or  
six foot from the dead tree and stands a little above a bridge  
over the said Collington Swamp
